Turning Our Visitors into Honored Guests


I've had the wonderful opportunity during this past month to take a look at St. Paul and Thayer with fresh eyes. As a newcomer, I have spent quite a bit of time looking at how the community sees us. Is the church easy to find in the phone book? Is it easy to locate on the internet? If you ask anyone in town for directions, are they likely to know where the church is located? These may seem like obvious questions for long-time attendees, but for a newcomer, it is vitally important that our location is easily found.

Likewise, once a guest arrives, how is he or she treated? Do we engage them in friendly conversation or do we just say hello and move on to speak with friends? Do we invite them to sit with us or perhaps join us for lunch or breakfast or even Sunday School? People decide whether they will return to this church long before the service ever starts. The impression we make in the first five minutes after they enter the doors determines whether or not they want to come back. For that reason, every one of us is an ambassador of the church. It is every person's responsibility to make our guests feel welcome. Genuine hospitality is a mark of a vital, successful congregation.

Notice I call our first-time and infrequent attendees "guests" rather than "visitors." There is an important distinction between guests and visitors. According to dictionary.com, a visitor is one who spends time at a particular location. A guest is one who receives hospitality. Do you see the difference? Greeting a visitor is not as personal as greeting a guest. We want to be known for our hospitality, for our welcome of guests into our church home. A good place to start is to practice hospitality on each other, but be ready to greet anyone you have not met before as a valued guest. In time, a warm and authentic greeting will become natural. But it takes practice to become comfortable greeting the strangers among us. You have been warm and welcoming to me, but you know I will be here for a while. Now, let us work together on welcoming our guests each Sunday. The St. Paul Witness Team is presenting a video "Extending Hospitality to People Who Aren't Here Yet," at 2 p.m. Sunday, August 14. The video will last about an hour and will be followed by a short discussion. All members and friends of the St. Paul and Alton UMCs are invited.
