The Alton UMM will host the Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts for breakfast beginning at 7:00 am.



The Oregon County Food Pantry in Alton operates out of the Community Worship Center (the CWC) once a month. Volunteers unload and organize commodities provided by Ozark Food Harvest of Springfield, MO, on the first Wednesday of the month. The next day, volunteers meet again to distribute these items to folks who meet income and residence guidelines. These items usually include frozen meats, vegetables, fruits, pasta, beverages, canned goods, cakes, cookies and breads. Occasionally, we distribute cleaning supplies, eggs, peanut butter, yogurt or pizza. Volunteers come from area churches and from the line of recipients. Students from Alton High School's BETA Club help recipients carry their groceries out to their vehicles. Our church's Emergency Food Pantry operates on a smaller but constant (24/7!) basis, with some of the same constraints. Our area food pantry efforts do not stop hunger in Oregon

County, but they do provide temporary relief and contact with caring neighbors.
