Hello Friends,

For the most part, Annual Conference was business as usual. The budget for 2016 passed without much discussion after the presentation and is slightly less than the 2015 budget. This will result in an overall reduction of total apportionments of \$17,994 or .1%. We will see later what that will mean for our churches. There were a few changes in some of the rules we operate as a conference, but nothing significant. The nominations for delegates for General and Jurisdictional Conferences next year went as normal. That means they went slowly. We were there until 10:00 Sunday night to get caught up on balloting because it got held up a little with the camping business. A good slate of delegates got elected to represent us at those meetings.

As far as the issue with the camp properties goes, there was much debate. At the end, the vote was to sell the four properties. There were three other proposals besides the main one to be considered, two of which would not have come up if the vote had been not to sell the properties. The only one that passed was the one to sell the Camp JO-Ota property to a local association in northeast Missouri that was formed for this purpose in hopes of keeping a Methodist camp facility in that area.


There were a number of workshops offered on Sunday afternoon. I attended one that was on how to create a discipleship pathway. The purpose is to align what the congregation is already doing to develop discipleship. Then the congregation filters out what is not working and focuses on ways of filling in gaps. In this model, there are four elements of a pathway through which we should evaluate our activities: Invitation, Education, Formation, and Mission.

During the course of the conference, there was great preaching and teaching and great times of worship. We heard from several leaders from our own conference and from Rev. Sue Nelson Kibbey from the West Ohio Conference. I hope next year we can have a lay delegate from our charge at Annual Conference.


