Witnessing Takes Planning

If you missed the workshop last month at St. Paul, you missed a great opportunity to sharpen your witnessing skills. There are many who think witnessing is somebody else's responsibility. After all, we have a witness team. They can take care if it, right? In the Great Commission, Jesus commands us to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19). This is Jesus' final instruction before he ascended to Heaven and it is directed at all of us, without exception.

It is common to confuse witnessing with evangelism and most folks I know are even more afraid of evangelism. But there is a difference. Evangelism involves sharing about the consequences of sin and God's plan of salvation through Jesus Christ. It includes inviting people into a relationship with Jesus. Witnessing is more personal. It is sharing your story about how you came to know Christ or why being a Christian makes a difference in your life. Everyone has a personal story to tell. One of the biggest obstacles to sharing our story is we don't know how to tell the story. We don't know where to begin. At the workshop we learned that it takes a little bit of planning. Take time to write out or think through your story, so when the opportunity to share arrives, you are not tongue-tied. Think through three questions: 1. What was my life like before I knew Christ?

- 2. What happened at the moment of your conversion? (How did you come to know Christ?)
- 3. What has my life been like since then?

Many lifelong Christians have experienced special moments when they feel closer to Christ. There may not have been a time when Christ felt especially near. It may have been a crisis or an illness or an especially challenging time. That type of story also is good for a witness. However you find your story, use the three questions above to organize it, and then write it down. It should be no more than three to five minutes.

We are often shy about sharing our stories because we have not practiced them. Sunday school or with family is a good place to practice with each other. I am looking for a few brave volunteers who would like to share their witness during an October worship service – one person each Sunday. When we practice among friends, we gain confidence in our stories and others may be inspired to share their stories. There is a sign-up sheet in the hall to pick your Sunday.



Once we have shared in the safe confines of the church, then it is time for the next step – sharing with people you encounter in your everyday life. We learned a great deal about how to be intentional about our sharing, but that will have to wait for another time. For now, think about your story, and then think about sharing it among your friends this month.
